 expenses, as well as any furniture damage your curious kitty may inflict. Estimates for the average lifetime expenses add up to $\$ 10,424$ for a cat living 15 years. Veterinary costs take up a large portion of those expenses.

Make an appointment and talk to your veterinarian about veterinary pet insurance and wellness plan options. And remember the goal is to keep your new feline friend happy and healthy for as long as possible-and that, of course, is priceless.

| Is my cat <br> getting <br> enough <br> exercise? | Playing with your cat twice daily is good for her <br> brain and body. <br> Annual cat toy costs: \$50 or more, if you opt for <br> cat trees and additional cat-friendly furniture <br> and toys |
| How do I <br> keep my <br> cat clean? | Your cat will take care of some of this herself. <br> You should invest in a good brush, and she may <br> require occasional professional grooming. <br> Annual grooming costs: \$20 or more, <br> depending on your cat's personal grooming <br> needs, coat, and more |
| What if I <br> need to <br> go out of <br> town? | If Fluffy isn't invited on your trip, you'll have to <br> book a room at her favorite pet hotel. <br> Average boarding costs per year: \$350 or more, <br> depending on accommodations |
